



## **SPRINGTIME SNATCH!**

A Fun Game of Visual Recognition and Swiftness of Hands!

## **GAME COMPONENTS:**

- 2 illustrated dice, with 6 illustrations on each (a total of 12 illustrations).
- 36 card games, featuring 2 illustrations one from each dice.
- 4 card-collection boards

## **SET THE STAGE:**

- Print the game components.
- Fold and glue the dice.
  (Optional: purchase a 6 cm 2 wooden cube and glue the paper onto the cubes.)
- Cut out the game cards.
- Cut out the card-collection boards.

## **GAME INSTRUCTIONS:**

- Suitable for Ages: 3-12
- Number of Players: 2-4
- Each player gets a card-collection board.
- Spread the 36 game cards on the table, with the illustrations facing up.
- Players take turns rolling the dice.
- All of the players look at the images that appear on the side facing up on both dice.
- Whoever finds the card featuring the two illustrations on the dice first, gets to keep the card and place it on their card-collection board.
- The player who fills their card-collection board first wins.
- If the dice show a combination that was already collected by one of the players, roll them again.

**For example,** two players roll the dice. One dice shows Paul, and the other one shows a swing set. The first player who spots a game card with an image of Paul and a swing set collects the card.



In American English, the singular form of "dice" is "die" (though no one uses it!). In British English, however, "dice" can be used to describe both singular and plural forms of this irregular noun.
